IMMEDIATE PAST CHAIR, HARBORD VILLAGE RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION

JOB DESCRIPTION

The Immediate Past Chair ("PC") is a voting ex-officio member of the Association.

Responsibilities:

- 1. The PC will serve until such time as a new Board Chair is elected. After leaving his/her position, the PC may seek election as a member of the executive or as an Area Representative
- 2. If necessary, the PC shall preside *pro tem* in place of the Board Chair, with the approval of the Board, pending either the return of the current Board Chair if the absence is temporary, or the election of a new Board Chair by the General Meeting
- 3. The PC shall assist the Board Chair in various tasks or projects as requested and on an ad hoc basis, and actively participate in community member engagement activities
- 4. On behalf of the Constitution Committee and the Board Chair, the PC shall coordinate the recruitment of new HVRA Board members by:
 - 1) Identifying such candidates from his/her own observation or from suggestions from other current or former members of the Board
 - 2) Maintaining a list of suitable candidates for all positions on the Executive and for the Area Representatives
- 5. The PC is the initial point of contact for newly-elected Area Reps and will coordinate and provide guidance for all Area Reps beyond that initial orientation and training:
 - 1) The latter role can be shared with and/or supported by another Area Representative as deemed appropriate by the PC
 - 2) The overall objective being to ensure the incumbent Area Representative:
 - has a complete understanding of the position and its reporting requirements;
 - understands the anticipated involvement in the various Association programs, activities, Committees and Portfolios;
 - is apprised of the information and resources available on the HVRA website, in particular the repository of reference materials and templates assembled on the Board's intranet site, and
 - is adequately prepared to support the residents and Board members in City Planning matters, such as patio licenses, noise issues, etc., and in other local community matters within his/her designated Area
