6. Other Business

a. Assistance of UofT Engineering students

b. Special events permits

Laura Bradbury reported that for the Fall Fair HVRA needs:

- it was agreed that Gus would call a meeting of the Fall Fair volunteers to discuss whether to continue serving alcohol

c. Business partnership (e.g. Escarpment Program)

Colin Furness distributed a proposal that was discussed electronically prior to the meeting. The chair and members thanked Colin for his great work; the only further suggestion was to change "Chair" for "President" in the 1st paragraph of the document Colin's proposed framework was approved.

d. How to kick-start the laneway naming process

- There are 47 laneways in the community
- Community participation and community building essential

Sue Dexter suggested that Gus Sinclair be "the Lane Czar" since he is so well connected, known and liked in the community. Agreed unanimously. Gus accepted and agreed to write a flyer for the residents inviting them to participate

e. Special reports

i. Meeting with BIA & Annex RA on improving conditions on Bloor St.

Tim reported that it was agreed by the organizations to support each other but not to create an ongoing committee

ii. Robert St. Heritage

Debby Black reported that Robert St. Heritage passed Council and in January it will be known whether there is an appeal to the OMB.

iii. Sally Bird Parkette meeting

Nicole Schulman attended Councillor Vaughan's meeting about this and another parkette, along with a handful of other Brunswick residents. Their suggestions for spending the \$100,000 in federal infrastructure money were to add adult exercise bars, more seating areas and a water feature near Brunswick to draw attention to the parkette. A landscape architect will develop a draft plan, which should be presented to local residents in March for their comments. The \$100,000 must be spent by March 2011.

iv. Save the Pools

David Booz and Tim were present at a Save the Pools meeting at Central Tech. Their assessment was that the participants at this school and Kensington Community School were passionate but small in numbers and not having enough time or resources to recruit enough user groups to keep the pools open before the December 31st deadline.

g. Traffic problem at Harbord & Bathurst

Moved by Wendy Smith, seconded by Stuart Schoenfeld

Whereas the intersection of Bathurst and Harbord is increasingly dangerous and difficult for left-turning drivers, we request the city perform a traffic study with a view of considering to install "advance lighting" which will include dedicated left-turn signals for drivers pproaching from all four directions.

Carried unanimously.

It was agreed that Tim and Susan would take this request to Councillor Vaughan.

h. Garbage problems

Concerns were expressed that there are no garbage containers on College St between Spadina & Bathurst and that consequently there is a lot of garbage on the street. Also, Caplansky's garbage problem, even though a bit better, is still not resolved

i. Volunteer Appreciation Night

Motion: beginning in 2010, the Chair may hold a Volunteer Appreciation Night in November or December to which all past and present members of the Board and Constitution Committee and such other persons as the Chair deems appropriate shall be invited and shall be reimbursed against receipts for the cost thereof to the annual limit of \$400.

Discussed but not decided upon.

i. History competition

It was proposed that the chair and the past chair bring forward a proposal for an essay competition (with prizes) on the history of Harbord Village for the purpose of posting it in the relevant section of the HVRA web site.
