Tim presented a request for the honorarium of \$100 or AGM speaker Dave Meslin. Gus moved to grant it and Wendy seconded; unanimously agreed

b. HV History project

Deferred, but Wendy pointed out that this project could be a comfort to those whose names wasn't used to name a lane, as the nominees could be commemorated as part of the history project. (There are 47 lanes to be named and it is anticipated that more than 47 names will be submitted.)

c. Community Builder Award for Cyril Greenland

d. Handling crime news & a public meeting on crime

Tim mentioned that there are different reactions of the residents to e-mails re crime in the neighborhood. The discussion at the meeting included the need for education about safety (Tim handed out a pamphlet called "Home Security, Protect Your Home" by Toronto Police), reminding residents to report suspicious events and be vigilant but not panicky unduly worried.

e. Fort York Letter

Wendy moved a motion that HVRA write a letter to the Ontario Premier and the Ontario Ministers of Finance, Infrastructure and Tourism & Culture, communicating our strong support for the City of Toronto's request for a provincial contribution of \$5-million towards the construction of the new Visitor Centre at Fort York National Historic Site. It was seconded by Gus and approved unanimously.

f. Lane clean-ups

An informal cleanup took place during one of Gus' recent lane way walk-abouts. There was a discussion whether a Spring & Fall clean-ups should be revived or whether residents should be reminded of their obligations to keep their part of the laneway clean. It was agreed that both are needed and that volunteers from schools should be sought.

g. Public meeting with UofT re Robert St. rink, parkette etc.

Tim summarized the meeting held at JCC on Nov.15th. There were about 40 residents and 3 representatives from UofT and Rebecca Hewitt from Councillor Vaughan's office. History of ownership and agreements regarding the use of the Robert St rink, field, parkette, tennis courts and a volleyball court at Sussex were presented. Currently the rink is unusable and Uof T has no plans to fix it. They are looking at all sports facilities and a report on the current and projected use is due in Jan 2012.

At the present time, Uof T owns the whole property and there are no agreements with the City for the public use of any part of it as there was in the past. The U of T representatives encouraged HVRA to submit proposals for changes that would make the area more usable. After the Uof T representatives left, the remaining participants discussed some ideas about how to secure some use of these spaces. Gus Sinclair, Wendy Rotenberg and Rene Roy volunteered to co-chair a committee to find out what our community wants and then present it to UofT.

Meeting was adjourned at about 8:00pm and many members relocated to 133 Major Street for Volunteer Appreciation Night
